1. How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

Plexiglass Desk Dividers and partitions have been installed. Students will enter through different entrances to avoid crowding and promote social distancing. Staff and students will continue to wear masks. Bathroom breaks will be staggered to avoid crowding and promote social distancing.

Transportation is provided by the School District of Philadelphia and AFPCS will follow the SDP guidelines.

PPE Stations have been placed throughout our buildings in hallways and other areas for ease of access. PPE stations contain extra masks, hand sanitizer and sanitizing wipes.

The AFPCS cleaning staff has a daily schedule of cleaning and sanitizing the school buildings.

Each Friday the buildings are thoroughly sanitized with electrostatic spraying equipment.

Ultraviolet air filtration systems have been installed in both of our buildings.

Staff and Students will be tested for Covid prior to beginning school and monthly.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

Students will continue to be educated by the qualified educators.

The school had a summer enrichment program to assist with any learning loss as a result of the pandemic and to assist with a smooth transition in returning to the classroom for the upcoming school year.

AFPCS is currently in the process of hiring additional support staff for additional social, emotional and mental health student support. Most recently, AFPCS added a Health Assistant to support with tracking and Covid related issues.

AFPCS will also hire additional interventionists for small group instruction targeting learning loss.

AFPCS has put in place a focus on "Trauma Informed Education" that consist of ongoing Professional Development to address social emotional needs of both students and staff.

We also plan to continue to offer our after school tutoring program for all students in the coming school year.

a. Universal and correct wearing of masks;	Students and staff will be provided with masks, required to bring masks and the schoolwill provide face shields.
	Visitor's access will be limited and they will be required to wear masks. ESSER funds willbe utilized to purchase PPE.

b. Modifying facilities to allow for <u>physical</u> <u>distancing</u> (e.g., use of cohorts/podding);

As scheduled, students will receive small group instruction that promotes social distancing and provides more targeted instruction. Small groups will follow a daily instructional schedule.

Students and staff will be provided masks, encouraged to bring masks and also provided face shields. Classrooms will be organized with students at least three feet apart with plexiglass shields on each desk/table.

Excess furniture will be removed to maximize space in the classroom and any common areas.

All communal spaces will have a oneway flow of traffic (hallways), hand sanitizer and hand washing stations available, and allow for the

appropriate social distancing requirements as well as the number of people permitted to gather. "Stay Safe" distancing signs will be placed 6 feet apart on the floor in every hallway. Frequent handwashing and use of hand sanitizer will be encouraged throughout the school day.

Frequently touched surfaces and student desks will be cleaned throughout the day as scheduled with our cleaning staff.

Thorough disinfecting of frequently touched surfaces and desks will occur nightly and halfday Fridays.

Students traveling to school by school bus and by SEPTA will follow the guidelines implemented by SDP Transportation and SEPTA.

Visitors, volunteers, and school partners will be excluded from working within the school building except when necessary, for instance, contracted providers of special services for students.

All parents, staff, and students will be

	trained on the school's Health and Safety Plan and protocols.
c. <u>Handwashing and respiratory etiquette</u> ;	All individuals sanitize/wash hands before and after eating, upon arrival and after restroom use.
	Hand sanitizer will be applied upon entry and dismissal from classrooms and after using any classroom materials.
	Bathroom use will have limited occupancy when in use.
	As outlined in current CDE guidelines, respiratory etiquette including the use of tissues for coughing and sneezing, proper disposal of tissues, and when necessary, coughing or sneezing into clothing or the inner elbow area will be encouraged for all staff and students.
d. <u>Cleaning</u> and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving <u>ventilation</u> ;	AFPCS will clean/disinfect all frequently touched surfaces 4 times daily (twice in the morning and afternoon) and as requested during the day (door handles, light switches, etc.) following all regulatory guidelines.
	No water fountain usage. Each hallway willhave designated places for water bottle refilling and students and staff are required tobring their own water bottles

	Clean desks daily following regulatory guidelines. Classrooms will have cleaning supplies available for use during the day and following individual student occupancy (minimize face to face interaction and multiplestudent touches on products).
	All individuals will sanitize/wash hands on afrequent basis (upon arrival, prior to eating, after eating, after sneezing and restroom use). Hand sanitizer machines and bottles willbe available in every room and common areas. Hand washing stations will be located in each hallway

	and common areas

Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State and local health departments;	As required by the School District of Philadelphia, AFPCS reports any active Covid case each day to PDE. PDE then assists with the contract tracing process.  Additionally, AFPCS will use the nurses' offices as isolation rooms when necessary for any cases discovered during the school day.  Active cases of students or staff are then required to quarantine at home for up to 14 days.  Contact tracing, isolation and quarantine is in handled in compliance with State and local health regulations.
f. <u>Diagnostic</u> and screening testing;	AFPCS will require all staff and students to be tested for Covid prior to the beginning of school. Regular screening will occur monthly.
g. Efforts to provide vaccinations to school communities;	AFPCS provides "testing" onsite but currently does not have a plan to provide vaccinations on site.

- Student support staff will coordinate supports for students who have been identified or who self-identify as needing social and emotional support, including, butnot limited to, counseling and social work services.
- Student Services staff will outline the counseling and SST referral process so thatstaff, parents, and students can easily refer students for assistance across academic, behavioral and mental health needs.
